The Forum meeting was a good and lively meeting with several invited speakers. It would have been better if a few more residents had come too. It was and is your chance to say what issues you are most concerned about in Popley.

The first guest was Blanche Miles Litter Warden for Basingstoke she explained the new re cycling scheme. The most common remark was that the dustmen just throw all the rubbish in the back of the van together. Blanche explained that the carts are divided so the rubbish is separated. Blanche is also responsible for leaf clearance and it was agreed that it had improved on last year but that there was still room for improvement.

PC David Page then told us that the "beat" now covered Chineham as well as Popley and introduced us to WPC Emma Beattie we now have three Bobbies the third one being PC Oliver. It was interesting to find that the level of crime was very small, there are however problems with the lighting over the bridge from Popley Abbeys to Oakridge and reports of harassing the more vulnerable people who live in Popley.

Bob Young, Crime Reduction Officer was our final guest he told us about himself and what his job entailed. Bob said that crime prevention was a multi agency responsibility. He spoke briefly about Neighbourhood Watch. In the discussion that followed an appeal was made for a co-ordinator for the Popley area for the Neighbourhood Care scheme Phone 332424. Do you know anyone that would be interested. Jane Frankum said that she had not heard from Stephen Bryers, Jane was eager to show him the lack of play areas, in particular at one side of Abbey Road. We are in the Gym at the John Hunt Centre on Friday evenings, there are 3 sessions:

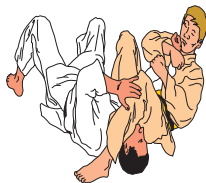

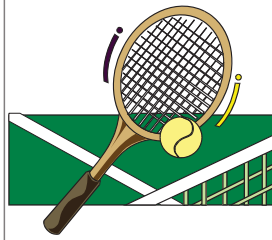
A GARDEN FOR EVERYONE
