With the festive period looming ever closer there are, I hope, plenty of opportunities for celebration, regardless of the weird situation we all find ourselves in with Covid. I hate to take a negative perspective on things but unfortunately this time of year also presents opportunities for criminal activity. As a result I would like to leave residents with some basic crime prevention advice.

When Shopping:

- Make sure your handbag is closed so a pickpocket would find it difficult to get into without you knowing.
- Never leave a bag unattended in a trolley, even if for a couple of seconds.
- Try to keep wallets in an inside pocket and out of sight from a potential pickpocket.
- When entering your PIN number at a terminal ensure no one can see you enter it.
- Try to pay for items on a debit card rather than carrying large amounts of cash. If this is not possible keep cash to a minimum.
- Before you leave your car, ensure all windows and doors are closed and locked.
- Avoid leaving your purchases and presents in your vehicle. If you must make sure they are not on display, store in the boot, and make sure the car is locked.
- Think about the item you are buying someone - are there any security products you could purchase to help them keep it safe? I.e. if buying a bike think about also getting an accredited D lock.

At Cashpoints:

- If you see someone suspicious hanging around, cancel the transaction and use another cashpoint.
- Before inserting your card have a look at the machine to check it looks normal.
- When entering your PIN number, make sure others around cannot see.
- Avoid carrying large amounts of cash. Only withdraw what you reasonably need.
- Put your money and your cards away safely before leaving the machine.

At Home:

- Don't leave Christmas presents in view of a window.
- Do not leave keys under doormats, or in easily accessible places.
- If you are buying or receiving valuable gifts such as bikes, mobiles or electrical items register them for free at www.immobilise.com in doing so you will assist the police in returning your property should it be lost or stolen.
- Dispose of present packaging carefully as empty boxes left outside can advertise that you have goods inside.
- Refrain from keeping large amounts of cash at home.
- A secure home will reduce the chance of a burglary. Make sure windows and doors are locked every time you leave the house.
- Avoid leaving tools and ladders lying around that could assist someone get into your home.
- When you go out at night make it appear that someone is home. Draw the curtains, and leave a light on. You could always put a lamp or radio on a timer switch.
- Never allow people into your home unless you are expecting them or have made arrangements with the company beforehand.
- Never buy goods and services at the door or give away personal information.

I hope everyone is able to have an enjoyable and trouble-free Christmas!

Popley West: At the last virtual meeting of the full council Labour Councillors put forward a motion to request our MPs to support and campaign for our service men and women of the Commonwealth to be allowed to stay in this country after their years of service in our British services. We are pleased to say it was passed unanimously. It is ludicrous that they can serve in war zones being prepared to lay down their lives for our freedom. After twelve years' service in the British services they should be given British citizenship. They are, after all, members from the countries that form our British Commonwealth.

On our regular "walkabouts" we were pleased to see more areas have been weeded, and hedgerows that are the responsibility of the borough cut back to clear pathways and make it safer to walk.

The Community Park has now been awarded to Wicksteed Park and they met on site to finalise the designs. We have been assured that work should start very soon We have asked for some drawings or photos to give an idea of what will be installed and we will post them on to the Popley Matters Facebook page as soon as we get them. Persimmons have still not reacted to the request made two years ago to change the name on the flats near their show rooms. For information the original, and still, Magnolia Court has been here in Popley for decades. Let's hope that valuable time is not wasted if the emergency services are called because of their unwillingness to simply change the name that they were asked to do months before the first one was even sold!

The area by Melrose Walk that has been turned

into a virtual car park is on the work list to improve the parking. However, the position it's in means about two years on the priority list. The list for Basingstoke and Deane is in the hundreds and will take a decade at least to complete and that's not counting all the new developments.

A Healthier Hampshire in a Heartbeat

"Have a heart and help a heart!"

Atrial Fibrillation (AF) is a debilitating heart condition. You may not have heard of it but it is more common than you may think. If you ask around your friends and family you may be surprised by how many people are affected

AF means living with persistent abnormal heart rhythm, palpitations, chest pains, and breathlessness and of course anxiety. Daily life becomes very difficult and people live in constant fear of another episode. Sufferers never know when they may have an episode, so working is difficult as is going out for the day or on holiday. An episode means a trip to A & E and possibly a stay in hospital and being sent home with drugs to hopefully temporarily control the condition while you wait to see the cardiologist

If the condition becomes more advanced the next level of treatment is cardiac/catheter ablation. It's a low risk but effective procedure that can be used to treat AF

If you live in Basingstoke or North Hampshire it means a trip to Southampton for treatment. Ironically the Cardiac consultant and heart rhythm specialist, Rob Bowers, is based in Basingstoke and has to make the same trip to treat you. Can you help us get this equipment at Basingstoke hospital so that local people with this condition and the consultant no longer have to make that 60 mile round trip?

Atrial Fibrillation (AF) sufferers in North Hampshire need your help to get treatment here in Basingstoke!

Basingstoke Deane Rotary is a group of 35 men and women from a wide variety of backgrounds. All live locally in the borough but some commute to work outside Basingstoke. Most joined Rotary to help others less fortunate, and they find Basingstoke Deane Rotary adds another extremely enjoyable dimension to their lives.

Alf is an AF sufferer. His first episode saw him taken from his doctor's surgery by ambulance to A & E and a few days in hospital. He lived with the debilitating symptoms for 6 months and had a treatment to reset his heart rhythm. Had this not been successful his next step would have been Ablation and, as he found out, a trip to Southampton for the treatment

Talking to his consultant he realised that with fundraising this vital equipment could be brought to Basingstoke North Hampshire Hospital. Patients can then be treated locally so that they no longer have to travel to Southampton

Under Alf's leadership Basingstoke Deane Rotary has set up a fundraising project:

"A Healthier Hampshire in a Heartbeat"

Rotary has already raised a substantial amount of money towards this equipment but we now need your help for the final push to make this happen and achieve Alf's goal to improve the lives of the numerous local people with this type of debilitating heart condition


"I cannot praise the hospice staff enough" Richard said "It gives people leaving this world the dignity they deserve."



Six tips when considering divorce

Last month also saw us having a look at hidden disabilities, with the Beavers & Cubs learning how people on the Autistic Spectrum can suffer from sensory overload and had a demonstration of this by being shown a video which had lots of over layered noises and images which overloaded their senses.

On the 13th October we had a look at our local area, with the Cubs and Beavers having to draw a map and placing on the map all the services they think a town or city needs. We then had a look at Basingstoke then and now looking photos to see how the town has changed over the years.


Probus Hears About an Unusual Hobby

Some people collect items as a hobby: stamps, books, antiques and so forth. David Rawden, a member of the Probus Club of Basingstoke, collected hills. They don't take up room in the house and they don't need dusting. After ascending all the Wainwright listed Lake District fells he turned his attention to the Pennines and county tops. He visited the highest point of all the English counties which gave him a Heineken experience – reaching those parts of the country people would not normally reach.

The highest is Scarfell Pike at 3209 feet situated in the Cumbrian mountains; the lowest is in Norfolk, Beacon Hill at 345 feet, just west of Cromer. Most tops are surmounted by a trig point or cairn so that you know you have succeeded. However, this does not happen in most eastern counties or those near to London. On one occasion he wandered through Pavis Wood near Tring trying to decide which hump was the highest point of Hertfordshire.

There are some tops not far from Basingstoke which can be accessed by a simple walk from a car park. One of these is Leith Hill near Dorking in Surrey and another is Whitehorse Hill, west of Wantage in Oxfordshire. Easiest of all is Ditchling Beacon, not far from Lewes in East Sussex. There is a large, pleasant summit area at Black Down, in West Sussex just south of Haslemere (Surrey). Walbury Hill in Berkshire, near Combe to the south west of Newbury, can be easily reached from the car parks at Inkpen Beacon. Continuing east along the Wayfarer's Walk brings you to Pilot Hill, the highest point of Hampshire situated just west of Highclere.

When we come out of lockdown some of the more active readers might like to visit a few of the local tops. They will be rewarded with a splendid view.






