You keep hearing such terrible stories of old and vunreble people being cheated in all sorts of ways. What can we do?

Editors reply These acts of fraud, deception and robbery just make my blood boil. There are however some actions you can take to minimise the risk of becomming a victim of these uninvited callers. Always ask to see some proof of identity and it should have their photo and name, call their boss, the number is on the card if they are genuine they never mind, in fact I have had some compliments when I have asked for proof do not let them into the house while you phone close the door and let them wait outside if they are genuine they wont mind. I never buy any services at the door whatever they are selling, even if they appear to be in a uniform or a smart suit. Another big giveaway is if they only have a mobile phone number this should send alarm bells ringing very loudly, they could easily be people who travel around from place to place they do not have a fixed address or office. The classic cons are tarmacing, gardening, tree cutting, roofs and driveways. You may think you have saved a lot of money but it is usually these people themselves who have told you how much they think it will cost to get the service and they always exaggerate

the cost. When things go wrong you have no one to complain to as they are long gone. They will only come to an area if they can find plenty of gulable people it is not always such a bargain. If you are not sure ring the police 08450454545.

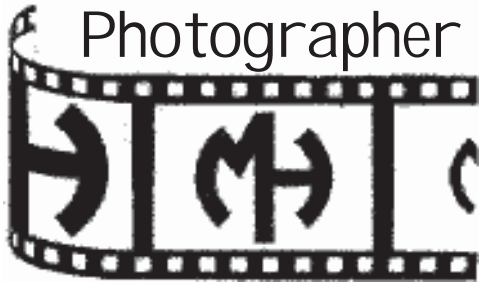

Diaries from the Old Codger

I want to take you back in time for a bit then come back to the present day. In 1917 a cold January night something happened in the East End of London that not only showed how people joined in harmony but no matter who you were or what religion you were every one helped each other. That was the t.n.t factory that exploded 70,000 homes and property were destroyed or damaged you could see the glow of the fires as far away as Brighton. Can you imagine most of Basingstoke being destroyed in a matter of a few seconds? But what happened after it was amazing, people lost every thing in the explosion, they only had what was on their backs as it were. But did that stop them within hours of it buildings were cleared people were found places to stay children were sent to outlying areas, some ended up in country mansions being taught by nuns

They had clean clothes shoes on their feet and full bellies some had never had that before. The whole country joined together by sending food and clothing for the victims. They still don't really know what happened but at one time it was believed to be German sympathisers. Still the East Enders got back to work in a short space of time it was one of the biggest ports in the country at the time so they needed the work force back on line. In 1941/2 another disaster hit London and that was bombs and rockets sent over by the Germans again thousands of homes were destroyed I know my mums old school took a direct hit killing 136 children and teachers. Yet again the country closed ranks around each other giving homes for the children in the country. Coming further up to date we had the I.R.A that thought it would be a good thing to blow up Londoner, this did not deter us we did not go around bashing and abusing the Irish just because of a few. Now to the present months we see yet again bombs in London, has it stopped the people of London NO. We in this country are built on strong morals and those morals get us through day after day, just look at the bombs that went off many were killed and injured but we still went back to work. No one in this country should want to be a so called martyr, in the Muslim religion it preaches peace and harmony if a fanatic dose this then they are not martyrs but will go to their equivalent of hell. So now we hear people are taking out there revenge on our ethnic communities Why? they do not want to be in conflict with you, we in our town have been lucky we have a good diversity of religions here and we have I hope harmony, but if any one wants to destabilise that then swift action should be taken by our police and courts.

You may have noticed that the railings and parapets are being painted along Popley Way, work started on August 22nd after requests for them to be painted some time ago, I know of at least one resident that agreed with me that they were looking neglected and untidy it will take some weeks to complete but it will be worth it. Hampshire County Council workmen chose to start by John Hunt Community School so that their railings can be completed during school holidays.

If you go along to the underpass by John Hunt School you will see some fantastic murals done by Junction 6, youth workers and some other helpers including some of our community wardens. I was privileged to be invited with Councillor Jane Frankum to go to the launch on August 19th the painting was really great. Everyone seemed to have their favourite bits mine was the train as you travelled up the slope away from John Hunt school. The youths made some very good speeches about how much they enjoyed doing something to help the community. The underpass is cheerful and well lit. One of the helpers said instead of "mind the gap" being painted on the wall on the train mural it should be "bridge the gap" and we all thought that was a wonderful idea.

The access road for the builders to use to build the new school has been completed and the next phase begins now. It looks like the school will be renamed Everest Community College after a survey and some questionnaires clearly showed that this was the preferred name by a big percentage.

The police have told me that the incidence of minibikes has decreased and there have been some prosecutions, but still there are some about. You can get a report/diary sheet from the police, wardens or Councillors they have proved to be very useful in identifying the culprits.

The constant selling of cars at busy T junctions has been a particular problem at the entrance to Abbey Road these vans and cars affect the sightlines and make it quite dangerous to try to see around, especially when it is large vans, pickup trucks and there's even been a camper. It also causes people to stop on the double yellow lines and is obstructing the road, they phone a mobile number and wait till the "seller" arrives. They do not have a traders licence but the same mobile numbers keep coming up at a lot more frequent times than someone who is buying a bigger or better car I am sure there are authorities that are now watching them and not just in Popley.

I went on the "Pride in your Place" walkabout on 16th August with some residents, Sentinel, Community wardens and County Councillor Jane Frankum, we reported a some fly tipping mostly in Abbey Road and Melrose Walk, general litter, brick walls with bricks missing all down Abbey Road and damage to paths from tree roots. These were all reported to the right agencies.

Thank you to all the people who were affected by the installation of the traffic lights in Popley Way especially to the residents of Trinidad Close and Specklewood Road the traffic lights were finished well ahead of time and during the school holidays, it is comforting to know that the crossing of the road to school and church will be much safer now.

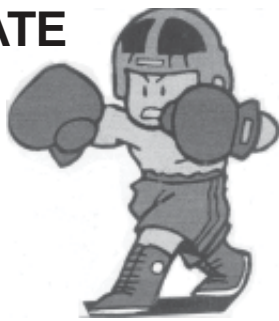

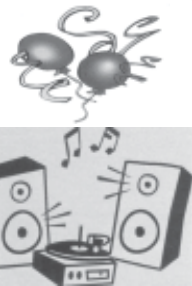

We are a friendly bunch of people of a wide range of ages, who enjoy social gatherings and "fun badminton evenings" throughout the season. Basingstoke and Deane has a variety of wardens working in its communities, all of which aim to make our streets safer. But what do the different wardens do? What powers do they have? And how do you get in contact with them?

Here's a brief explanation of who does what:

Community Wardens

Now in its second year, the Community Wardens Scheme is led by Basingstoke and Deane Borough Council, in partnership with Kingfisher Housing Association and Sentinel Housing Group. Ten wardens, working in pairs, patrol five different areas to help improve the local environment and engage residents in helping to resolve issues and help to make your community a place to be proud of. The wardens patrol Tadley and Bishops Green, South Ham, Oakridge, Popley and Kempshott and Buckskin, wearing distinctive green tops. They do not have enforcement powers, do not make arrests or prosecute people, issue cautions, or intervene in violent crime. The Popley wardens are Stephen and Sarah and they regularly hold the Mocktails evenings, and get involved with various community events. The wardens can be contacted by calling 01256 845508 or by e-mailing community.wardens@basingstoke.gov.uk

Accredited Community Safety Officers (ACSOs)

There are seven ACSOs working in Basingstoke and Deane as part of a pilot project run by Hampshire County Council. Patrolling on foot and in marked vans, the uniformed ACSOs act as a deterrent to anti-social behaviour and aim to prevent low-level crime. The ACSOs do carry some powers of enforcement – the Community Wardens do not. They can issue £50 fixed-penalty notices for such things as littering, graffiti and fly-tipping. The ACSOs work closely with the local police, community wardens and other local agencies. You can contact the ACSOs by calling 0845 600 1747 or e-mailing community.safety@hants.gov.uk

Police Community Support Officers (PCSOs)

The PCSOs started patrolling the town centre earlier this year. Two civilian PCSOs are being employed by Hampshire Constabulary to assist in tackling anti-social behaviour and minor offences. Wearing police-style uniforms, they have the power to detain suspects for up to 30 minutes until a police officer can attend, as well as being able to issue fines for certain minor offences. PCSOs are being introduced right across England and Wales.

Hampshire Constabulary

In Basingstoke and Deane, we have 20 local community beat officers patrolling urban and rural locations. They are dedicated to local policing issues, working with partners to address local issues of concern and are backed-up by hundreds of police officers operating across the force. Easily recognisable in their standard black and white uniforms, the beat officers have all the usual police powers to deal with crime and disorder. You will usually see the beat officers patrolling on foot or on their mountain bikes, wearing high visibility reflective jackets. You can contact Basingstoke Police by calling 0845 045 4545 or, in emergencies only, on 999.

DO YOU HAVE TIME TO CARE?
