





# Popley Pilot Hailed a Success

After a hugely successful five year pilot scheme in Basingstoke, Hampshire Fire and

Rescue Service is set to build on the success of its temporary fire station at the Popley Fields Community Centre.

Hampshire Fire and Rescue Service took the decision in 2005 to run a pilot scheme which would see the Service operate a temporary fire station from the Popley Community Centre in Basingstoke. The pilot proved so popular that the temporary station remained in place for the following three years.

As a result of the scheme, the number of incidents in this particular area of Basingstoke and Deane Group has decreased significantly. There is also a greater level of fire, road, and community safety awareness - as well as more properties fitted with smoke alarms than ever before!

Group Manager Dave Norgate of Hampshire Fire and Rescue Service said "The pilot scheme has been a great success and we wish to thank everyone who has assisted us, in particular the staff of the community centre who have been most accommodating.

"I would also congratulate the residents of Popley for welcoming us into their community and for engaging with our fire crews to such an extent that it has shaped our thinking and the way we will deliver our services in the future.

"With risk at its lowest level in a number of years, it now seems a wholly appropriate time for Hampshire Fire and Rescue Service to focus on other areas of the town where risk is higher."

Group Manager Norgate added "We want to take what we have learned from Popley Fields and use this knowledge in other areas. We will still have a visible presence in the Popley area and, of course, the fire and rescue service is only ever a phone call away. Residents will still see us carrying out home safety visits in the area, working in partnership with Forestry Commission wardens, and undertaking life-saving arson reduction activities in the community."

#### Stay Safe On The Roads.

#### Don't drive tired -

- Plan in a 15 minute rest break for every 2 hours of driving.
- > Avoid making long trips between midnight- 6am and 2-4pm when natural alertness is low.
- > Share the driving if possible.

#### Don't drink drive -

- > Nearly one in six of all deaths on the road involve drivers who are over the legal alcohol limit.
- > The only safe option is not to drink any alcohol if you plan to drive and never offer an alcoholic drink to anyone else who is driving.
- Driving whilst above the legal limit or unfit through drink carries a maximum penalty of 6 months' imprisonment, a fine of up to £5,000 and a minimum 12 months driving ban.

#### Don't use your mobile phone while driving -

- On 27 Feb 2007, the £30 fine was increased to £60 and three penalty points on your licence. Penalty points = higher insurance costs.
- If you get six points within two years of passing your test, your licence will be revoked and you will need to re-sit the test.
- If the case goes to court, you could risk a maximum fine of £1,000, which rises to £2,500 for the driver of a bus, coach, or heavy goods vehicle.

#### Always buckle up -

- The law says that all children up to 135cm tall (around 4'5"), or the age of 12, whichever comes first, in the front or rear seats in cars, vans and other goods vehicles must travel in the correct child restraint for their weight.
- Adults travelling in the rear of a car must also use seat belts, if they are fitted. It is the responsibility of the adult passenger (not the driver) to ensure that they are using the seat belt.

One of the first things I discovered when I became a Christian was the truth of those words and that God has the most amazing plan for my life.

Whatever your hopes and plans for the coming year I'll be praying that you may discover the eternal hope held out in the message of Christmas and fulfilled at Easter. St Paul wrote: "May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit." Perhaps you might consider making it a New Year's resolution to discover God's plan for your life – you won't regret it!



#### Your rights to return goods or gifts to shops

When you buy goods you form a contract between the buyer and the seller which is legally binding and is covered by a law called the Sale of Goods Act 1979. If you have purchased goods, from a trader, that have become faulty or were the charity for not as described when you purchased them or are not fit for the purpose for which your community you bought them, read the information below and know your consumer rights.



You do not have a legal right to a refund if you have simply changed your mind about a purchase or decided that you do not like it. However, although you may not have the legal right to a refund it is possible that the trader may take back the goods and give a refund.

#### Your legal rights when you buy goods

When you buy goods from traders based in the UK (including goods supplied as part of a service), the law gives you certain rights as a consumer. The law says that the goods must:

- be of satisfactory quality. This means that the goods should be free of any faults, including minor ones. They should be of the quality that a reasonable person would expect given the description, price and any other relevant circumstances.
- be fit for the purpose. This means that you must be able to use them for the purposes that you would normally expect from this type of product, or any purpose that you have told the seller you want to use them for
- match their description. This means that if there is a verbal or written description of the goods, it must be accurate.

#### Your rights when things go wrong

If you buy goods from a trader and they are not of satisfactory quality, fit for purpose or don't match their description, the trader will probably have to put things right. It is the trader who is responsible for this, and not the manufacturer. If a trader tells you the manufacturer is responsible, or that you have to make a claim on a manufacturers' guarantee, you do not have to accept this.

Depending on the circumstances, you may have one or more of the following rights:

- to get all of your money back
- to get some of your money back
- to get the goods repaired
- to get the goods replaced
- to get compensation.

#### You will not have these rights if:

- there is nothing wrong with the goods you have just changed your mind about wanting them
- you examined the goods, or a sample of the goods, when you were buying them, and the fault you want to complain about was so obvious that you should have noticed it
  - the trader pointed out the defect that you now want to complain about
  - you have damaged the goods yourself
  - the problem is the result of normal wear and tear
  - the goods have lasted for as long as could reasonably be expected.

#### If the goods were a gift

If you receive goods as a gift and they are faulty, do not match their description or aren't fit for purpose for which you bought them, the person who actually bought them should be the one to make the complaint. However, you can make a complaint to the trader yourself, as long as the person who bought the goods for you told the trader when they bought them that they were going to be given to you.

Ideally, your name should be written on a receipt, invoice or guarantee card as proof that the goods belong to you. If arrangements were made to deliver the goods to you, rather than the person who bought them for you, this could also be used as proof.



The Council employs a dog warden, provided by a contractor, to deal with dog related matters, such as the collection and kennelling of stray dogs and the enforcement of dog fouling law.



## **Stray Dogs**

Stray dogs are collected and taken to kennels

whilst the dog warden makes contact with the owner. Normally the strays are returned to the owner quite quickly and the owner pays a fee of £25, but if the strays have to be kennelled, the owner must also pay the cost of kennelling which is between £25 and £81.

If you own a dog it must have a collar and tag whenever it is outside of your house. This is particularly important if the dog escapes as it allows us to return the dog to you quickly. You could also have the dog micro-chipped by your vet. The dog warden has a scanner which reads the chip and can then return the dog to you.

**Dog Fouling**The dog warden also spends a lot of time dealing with dog fouling where inconsiderate owners fail to clean up after their dogs have fouled. The dog warden can issue £50 fines on the spot to people not cleaning-up after the dogs on land which is open to the public anywhere in the Borough.

In some parks there are special bins for people to put in the dog droppings but generally litterbins should be used for this purpose.

#### SHERBORNE ST. JOHN PARISH COUNCIL

There is concern for the safety of Everest Community College students climbing over a bank on Chineham Lane on their way to and from school. The PC has been urging Hampshire County Council to give high priority to extending the pavement over the grass bank to link up with the footpath. This work is now planned but will not be implemented until the next financial year which starts in April.

A further invitation has been received from BT to adopt red telephone kiosks in the village. As you will recall the PC has resolved to adopt the Elm Road box opposite the post office. This time BT has included the other box in Spring Close, which when I last looked, was in a terrible state of repair. Should the PC retain this box at an annual cost to the parish or ask BT to remove it and make good? What are your views?

Several councillors and interested parties attended a BDBC Climate Change Challenge for Communities event in October. They reported that a new Greening Campaign, based on carbon reduction (and associated cost savings), education and community action, could provide a practical approach to engaging parish residents with climate change. The PC agreed to encourage community involvement in this campaign, initially for the village of Sherborne St. John, with financial support of up to £250 and committee representation by two councillors, Carole Stanley and Becky Jones. If you are interested in green issues and would like to help please contact our parish clerk or the two councillors above.

As you may have seen in the Basingstoke Gazette the No 36 bus service is 'under review'. The No 36 runs through Sherborne St John to Ramsdell, Baughurst and Stoney Hill. The service suffers from a lack of support and is therefore very expensive to subsidise. We understand that the bus may be replaced by a taxi service or community transport and the PC are requesting more details. If you will be affected and have concerns please let us know.

The PC has a number of projects planned for the coming months including development of the Chute play area, safe pedestrian access to the Chute car park, restoration of water to Sunnyside allotments, a replacement notice board for the village hall, a lych gate for the open cemetery. Next year we will be considering the purchase of another Speed Indicator Device (SID). Whilst we always seek grants for these projects it is clear that future financial budgets will be more constrained and this will reduce the assistance available to us.

With regard to our parish budget the PC has agreed to freeze any increase in precept for the coming 2010-11 financial year.

One of the special characteristics of our parish is the friendship and neighbourliness of residents which has evolved over many years. I am also reminded as we turn the new year of the heavy snow falls of last winter. If we experience days of freezing snow and ice let us each make a note to keep in touch with our elderly and less able neighbours. *Chris Cooke*

## Save Chineham Park Primary School





On December 17<sup>th</sup> Hampshire County Council decided to go ahead with closure of Chineham Park Primary School. Notices of closure will be published in the New Year, with a final decision due in March.

HCC want to close Chineham Park due to falling numbers on roll and surplus places in other schools. But with the new build starting up again after a 12-month lull due to the recession, this argument will be increasingly hard to understand for most residents/

HCC are also quoting the inadequacies highlighted by the January 2009 Ofsted Inspection which put the school in Special Measures. The school has been in and out of trouble for quite some time, but it was in a much worse position 5, 10 or 15 years ago. And its 2009 results were amongst its best ever and better than some of its neighbouring schools.

A petition to save the school was handed in but to no avail. The Save Chineham Park campaign set up by parents has been successful in raising the profile of the school but has not been successful in saving the school, although we are not finished yet, as the final decision is not until March!

Chineham Park was built 40 years ago. Originally it was two schools – an Infants and a Juniors, with the Infants school being closed down over 10 years ago and being demolished to make way for Hathaway Gardens. The fear of many residents is that the remaining school will suffer the same fate.

The County Council has given assurances that the school site will be retained for educational and community purposes. But past precedence in cases such as Cranbourne Infants school shows that the building will be kept for about 5 years before being demolished to make way for housing. We must not let that happen, but this is the County Council we are talking about, they will do what they like and if they see the opportunity to sell the site and make some money in a few years' time, they are likely to take it.
